**Year 6 2024 SATs** - usually in the first or second week of May each year, Year 6 pupils nationally have to sit some tests known as the SATs (Statutory Assessment Tests) in Grammar, Punctuation, Spelling; Reading and Maths (Arithmetic and Reasoning). Our pupils worked really hard and gave it their best and regardless of the outcomes, it is important to celebrate how hard they have worked through them as they were not easy! Read more about this below.

**Parent consultations** - attendance at the consultations has improved slightly with most classes having over 80% taking time out to meet their child's teacher and receive an update on how they are doing. It is really important for parents and carers to maintain communication with teachers to ensure they know what is going on and also how to help children at home.

**Peace Mala Ambassadors** - our ambassadors went to Trafford COuncil and represented the school on our Peace Mala work in front of lots of headteachers! They were so confident.



**Nursery** have had a very exciting half term! We have been thinking about **growth and change**. We planted sunflower seeds and watched them grow. We can't wait to see the flowers bloom. We have had a slight improvement in attendance but we still have a lot of families going away during term time. Sadly, not one class has an average of over 96.6% which is our target. A few years ago we used to see some classes achieving 100% - let's make this our aim for next term for at least one class to get this!

We are seeing more and more families taking between 5 and 15 days around the school holiday times and absences during term time will be **unauthorised**. It is extremely difficult for children to catch up with their education that is lost as a result. Pupils with below 90% attendance are classed as **persistent absence** but we have a number of pupils who are below **50% classed as severely absent** which is very upsetting.
