Welcome to our Autumn 2 newsletter. It has been another busy term indeed!

News

This is one of the longest terms of the year with a lot to get through. **Assessments** have taken place to find out what pupils know and what learning needs to take place to get them to their end of year expectations. It is <u>absolutely vital</u> for pupils to attend school every day to avoid missing important learning. Quality time at home with their reading and homework tasks greatly helps pupils to avoid falling behind.

Flu vaccinations have taken place to help immunise children against the virus.

Our Christmas Jumper Day fundraiser raised £309! All the money will go towards the charity, Save the Children, who support children all over the world. Thank you for your kind donations.

Enrichment

Parent events

We had our second **Chai Coffee morning** this term which was very well attended! Parents had an opportunity to learn how to use our online apps like Century and Accelerated Reader. Our talented Digital Ambassadors and student council helped out!

Actions taken from the first Chai.Coffee morning - we introduced a morning club again (which is free!); spelling homework (we bought a programme called Spelling Shed for Years 5 and 6) and explored adult family support courses (watch out for dates in January for this!)

We had three amazing Christmas events which were really well attended. Our pupils feel so proud when parents and carers come to see what they are doing so thank you for this.

Parent consultations took place in November. Sadly the number of attendance was very low, only 70% - about 20 out of 30 parents on average- came to see their child's teacher. But well done to Nursery Butterflies with **100%** of parents and carers attending their appointment!

Attendance:

We got off to quite a good start and slowly got closer to our target, but sadly we have had a lot of illnesses towards the end of the term, as you can see from the table below. Over **70 persistent absence letters** have been sent out for pupils with **below 90%** attendance which is very concerning. We still have a lot of families going away during term time - the **penalty charge** by the council is £180 per parent per child.

Children taken out of school for **20 days or more** will lose their school place.

The best attending class gets treats every week and pupils with the most improved attendance get a certificate from Miss Oven!

Lateness - we have **over 30 pupils** regularly arriving very late in the morning and a few at hometime. This causes disruption to learning, as well as adding pressure on the office staff. Please note persistent late pick up will incur a **£5 charge**.
