
### Trips and enrichment opportunities

#### **Curriculum News**

#### Nursery

This half term Nursery has been learning about **Adventures** and

Journeys. They have looked at vehicles that travel on land, water and air. They brought pictures from their holidays and were able to talk about how they travelled there.



This week they got their boarding passes ready and went on a plane, everyone enjoyed the journey and arrived safely.

#### Reception

Reception's topic this half term has been all about **Adventures** and **Journeys**. The children enjoyed going on a train journey around our



playground. They bought tickets, boarded the train and had their tickets checked by the conductor before embarking on their journey. The children also learnt all about **Chinese New Year** and how it is celebrated, including making their own sauce for some noodles and ate it in our Chinese Restaurant!



#### Year 1

This half-term Year 1 have enjoyed learning all about weather and seasons. We have carried out science experiments to track the weather in Manchester and then compared this to other countries in the world.

#### Year 2

Year 2 have been super busy again this half term learning all about maps, compasses and continents in Geography. We have carried out LOTS of experiments in Science, learning about waterproof and absorbent materials in order to work out which would be the best for a pirate ship. If you ask us, we definitely know now! Meanwhile, we have been learning gymnastic routines in PE and working collaboratively. What a whirlwind!





#### Year 3

Year 3 have had another brilliant half term. In History we have been focusing on the Ancient Greeks and have learnt all about timelines. In English we used our Greek knowledge to write our



own diary entries based on the first olympic games. We also really enjoyed Numbers Day!

#### Year 4

Year 4 have had another fantastic term with lots of brilliant learning! In **Science** we have been learning about teeth and how to keep them healthy. We also did a practical experiment to represent our **'Digestive System'**. It got pretty messy but was



lots of fun! In **Maths** we have been working hard with our **position and movement**, **division** and **times table** work which hopefully will help us with our Multiplication tables check!

#### Year 5

Year 5 have been immersed in all things **Tudors** this half term. We took a trip to Ordsall Hall to experience life as a Tudor and we have created Tudor **portraits**,



focusing on our paint mixing skills to do so in our **art** lessons. The children have impressed us greatly by creating wonderful pieces of **atmospheric writing** to describe the beheading of Anne Boleyn.

#### Year 6

Year 6 had a visit from a **STEM** ambassador linking with our previous science topic of **Electricity**. The pupils were shown how the simple circuits they built within their science lessons are related to real-life and how they



could all easily become electricians of the future.





#### **Star Group**

Star Group had fun writing a set of **instructions** in **English** and then following their instructions to make a yummy **pizza** in the afternoon!



#### School uniform and PE kits

It is wonderful to see the majority of children coming into school in their uniforms. A reminder that footwear - shoes and trainers - must be **black.** 



**PE kits** - we have got a lot of pupils coming into school on their PE days in school uniform. These pupils will not be allowed to take part in PE and parents will be contacted to make sure the correct clothing is worn.

- Plain white t-shirt
- Plain black shorts/PE skirt
- Plain black leggings
- Plain **black** jogging bottoms for outdoors
- A plain tracksuit top/jacket is during colder weather Suitable footwear should be worn for PE such as trainers (outdoors) and pumps (indoors).

Close fitting hijabs/headscarves designed for PE and sport participation may also be worn.

Hoodies without a zip are not safe - children will have to take these off in order to join in lessons.



### **Extra-curricular Clubs**

This term has seen the continued success of **MITC** (Manchester City in the community) in school working with the Foundation stage, supporting the development of their fundamental movement skills. We have had **Dodgeball** with Mr Real for Years 4 and 5.

**Early Start Club** is going well with pupils attending regularly.
